A "Belle of St. Johnsville"

Last March (2023) the Palatine Settlement Society at Nellis Tavern received by donation a framed oval oil portrait, circa 1840, of an attractive young woman. The donor, Daniel Ehle of Johnstown, had been given the portrait several decades ago by a lady who said the sitter was a young woman "from St. Johnsville."

To date, the subject's identity remains unknown. Her hairstyle and clothing, including her gold "cannetille" jewelry and

delicately wrought lace collar, date the portrait to about 1840. She does not wear the type of lace cap usually associated with married matrons, so she might be single, engaged, or very recently married.

The portrait is apparently unsigned, and the artist is as yet unidentified. The sitter's pose and the portrait's dark background resemble the works of Mohawk



Valley portrait artists Samuel Sexton and Charles K. Palmer, but research is ongoing. Her true identity might never be discovered, and until then she remains a "belle of St. Johnsville."

Nellis Tavern's current period of "interpretation" is about 1840, the date of the portrait. The core of the building dates to the mid-18th century, but it was enlarged and lengthened in the early 19th century, about the time the Mohawk Turnpike (approximately present-day NYS 5) was constructed, and the Tavern was not only a home for the Nellis family, but a focus of refreshment for the traveler as well.
